A nursery is provided for children younger than 3. Preschoolers (age 3-Kindergarten) are invited to leave after "Let the Children Come" for our W.O.W. (Working on Worship) experience.

For Those with Special Needs

Thank you for joining us for worship! We love our historic buildings, but know they can be a challenge for those with mobility needs. Know that we are committed to doing all we can to make this space welcoming to everyone. Reserved seating for those in wheel chairs and those sitting with them is found near the elevator, and is marked with signs on the walls and on the back of the pews. If you have special hearing needs, please ask one of the ushers to bring you a hearing assistance device from the sound booth in the back, or feel free to go back there and get one. 

Advent Devotionals

Pick up Advent devotionals in the office lobby or education lobby.

The Dawn Chorus: Songbirds know a thing or two about singing into darkness: in the wee hours of the morning, before the sun appears over the horizon, they begin a great symphony that scientists call the "dawn chorus." Advent is the church's dawn chorus. This devotional walks through the season's four weeks, singing into shadows and looking to the light. Please be sure to also pick up the extra sheet of bird ornaments.

Naming Jesus (For families with youth and children): There's so much in a name. This devotional is all about the many names we give to Jesus, and the life-changing names he gives to us. Organized around the season's four traditional themes (Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love), this devotional features a simple, home-based weekly Advent service. Several accessible, family-friendly practices round out each week, all designed to bring a little more meaning and mystery to your Christmas preparations and celebrations.
